Privacy Statement

1. General confidentiality

Any information received by Peter G White Ltd – be it through voice, paper or electronic means – shall remain confidential and cannot be passed on to any third party without the consent of the client. This includes the matter that one is, or has been, a client of Peter G White Ltd.

2. Personal data

The introduction of the *European Union General Data Protection Regulation* in May 2018 formalises practices which Peter G White Ltd has followed since the inception of the company.

Personal data - as defined by the *European Union General Data Protection Regulation* - relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information which is either in the possession of Peter G White Ltd or likely to come into such possession. Information related to identified and identifiable individuals - including, for example, corporate email addresses with individual names – is not disclosed or processed in any other way other than for Peter G White Ltd to communicate with that individual. We do not share such data with any third parties without the written permission of the person concerned.

3. What information is maintained

The only information maintained is that which is integral and necessary for the provision of professional services by Peter G White Ltd.

4. Who maintains data

The Managing Director of Peter G White Ltd is the 'data controller' as defined by *European Union General Data Protection Regulation* – that is, the person who decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.
